



**The Irish Education Alliance Calls for Immediate Cessation of the Covid-19 Vaccination Programme for Children
(March 2022)**

The Irish Education Alliance (IEA) is a growing organization comprising primary, secondary, third level and early years teachers and educators across Ireland. As professionals who work with children and adolescents, the health and wellbeing of our students is of paramount importance and is currently under threat.

In response to overwhelming quantities of published evidence on adverse reactions and high mortality rate following vaccination, the IEA calls for an immediate end to the Covid-19 vaccination programme for children and adolescents in Ireland and the withdrawal of mRNA injections, on trial, from the Irish market. The evidence suggests that they are not safe for human use and are not fully tested or properly monitored. We believe that children are being put at risk of serious harm, in violation of the Children First Guidance (2015).¹

A recent safety update on Covid-19 vaccines, published by the Health Products Regulatory Authority (HPRA) on the 24th March² states that ‘as of 15 March, a total of 19,869 reports of suspected side effects were notified’ and that there were 401 reports of suspected side effects in children and adolescents aged 5 to 17 years, from the Comirnaty vaccine alone. There were 110 reports made to the HPRA of deaths following vaccination. The safety update acknowledges an increase on myocarditis and pericarditis following vaccination, particularly in adolescent males and lists numerous side effects and injuries that have occurred. Despite this extremely worrying evidence to the contrary, the HPRA continue to endorse the vaccination programme, suggesting that the benefits outweigh the risks ‘based on scientific evidence of protection against illness’, which they do not provide.

Court-ordered information released by Pfizer in response to freedom of information requests, shows that within three months of the emergency use authorisation of their vaccine, there were 42,086 adverse reactions, of which 11,361 have not recovered and 1,223 have died. An FDA factsheet released in 2021 shows that 86% of children showed an adverse reaction to the Pfizer vaccine in the clinical trial³. The long list of post vaccination adverse reactions and

medical conditions, published in the recently released Pfizer data includes myocarditis, pericarditis, blood clotting and neurological disorders⁴. The US Food and Drug Administration added a warning about the risk of myocarditis and pericarditis to fact sheets for Moderna and Pfizer-BioNTech Covid-19 vaccines.

Figures are available on the UK (Yellow Card Reporting System), US (VAERS) and Europe (EUDRAvigilance) which show alarming numbers of vaccine injuries, adverse reactions and deaths⁵. On the 9th February 2022 the European Database of Suspected Adverse Drug Reports (EUDRAvigilance) showed 39,997 Covid-19 vaccine deaths and over 3.5 million injuries. It is widely accepted that as little as 1 – 10% of adverse reactions are reported.

Covid-19 is not a threat to children and young people. According to the CDC, healthy children 18 or younger have a 99.9% rate of recovery from COVID-19 without any treatment. CSO figures show that there were no Covid-19 deaths in Ireland, in people under 25 from February 2020 to April 2021⁶. The HSE website and independent research studies⁷ state that children with Covid 19 are likely to have very mild illness even with underlying health conditions. Should a child become ill from Covid-19, effective treatments are available which will allow them to make a full recovery, giving them lasting natural immunity. There is no evidence that the vaccinations reduce symptoms in children, and they do not prevent transmission - yet this is implied by the Irish Government and HSE to be a major benefit of having children vaccinated.

IEA educators are expressing an urgent call for parents to be informed objectively of the potentially serious repercussions of choosing to have their children vaccinated against Covid-19. Currently important information is being denied to parents. They are not being informed that the Covid-19 'vaccination' is actually an experimental mRNA gene therapy which has only been approved for emergency use. Data on resulting side effects, including deaths and injuries have been omitted and understated in product information and HSE leaflets. Participation in an ongoing medical trial under emergency use authorisation should be entirely voluntary, with the full informed consent of a child's parents. Where coercion, misinformation and manipulation of data occurs, it is a direct contravention of the Nuremberg Code and considered a crime against humanity. Considering the live case (6029679/21) being taken against the UK government for crimes against humanity and the associated case in the International Criminal Court, this is something the authorities in Ireland should take very seriously.

The IEA does not condone the promotion or encouragement of unauthorised, untested, corporate medical products within Irish educational establishments. We are calling for an enquiry into, and the immediate cessation of, coercive emails to school boards, principals and

places of education, encouraging them to forward HSE misinformation to parents. It is not within the remit of a school or educational institute, to issue medical advice, to encourage or to coerce parents into having their children registered for any medical treatment. Nor is it ethical to coerce children directly, for example through praising them for having received a Covid-19 injection. We have witnessed this happening in many schools, as well as receiving testimonies from parents. We consider the leaflets and links to HSE information sent to parents via schools, including cartoons for children on going to the vaccination centre, to be deeply negligent, misleading and biased. As previously stated, this information does not outline clearly the extent, frequency and severity of adverse reactions experienced during the clinical trial phase and during the vaccine roll out. It does not inform parents that these gene therapies are not fully authorised for use or adequately tested.

Research studies show that Covid-19 vaccinations do not prevent transmission⁸ and the recent surge of cases in Ireland, where there has been a high vaccine uptake, demonstrates this. Even if the vaccines were effective, the Universal Declaration on Bioethics and Human Rights states that “It is unethical to put children and young people at risk to protect adults”⁹. The IEA are gravely concerned for the welfare and safety of children and young people who have been receiving these mRNA treatments, believing that they will protect loved ones, prevent transmission or reduce symptoms. We call for the Department of Health and the HSE to cease the unlawful distribution of misinformation via educational institutions on the ‘safety’ and ‘efficacy’ of Covid-19 injections. All who create, distribute and promote this misinformation are liable for injuries, damage or death caused due to the ‘vaccination’ of children.

In conclusion, the IEA is of the opinion that the HSE, NPHET, Government and Irish media are risking the health and lives of young people in Ireland, for no benefit, by promoting and administering an inadequately tested, dangerous pharmaceutical product without informed consent. Covid-19 poses a negligible threat to children and young people and this experimental vaccination does not prevent transmission or reduce severity of the virus for them. Continuing with the vaccination roll-out in light of the evidence now available, some of which is presented here, amounts to crimes against humanity.
